




General introduction



Divorce and Marriage Statistics 2021 - published on 27 February 2023

- 106 499 number of marriages
- 18 208 divorces finalised (increase by 13.1%)
- statistically 18 out of every 100 will get divorced










Each party shares in half of the growth of the other party's estate

Married out community of property with accrual (ANC)



It is important to know how you are married



Married in community of property (default)

- spouses become one
- jointly own all assets and liabilities
- do not have your own legal identity or separate estate apart from your spouse

Married out of community of property without the accrual (ANC)


- estate of each spouse is kept separate
- what is mine is mine, and what is yours is yours
- one spouse might leave with less than the spouse with the stronger financial position

Married out of community of property with the accrual (ANC)

- spouses maintain
 separate estates as prior
 to their marriage
- spouse whose estate
 shows the smallest growth
 is entitled to half of the
 growth of the estate of the
 spouse with the largest
 estate

There is **no common law marriage** in South Africa. Cohabitation does not create any automatic legal rights and duties between couples.

Irretrievable breakdown of the marriage

...no reasonable prospect for the marriage relationship to continue...

- emotional abuse;
 - physical abuse;
 - verbal abuse;
- if the other partner has an addiction problem like drugs, alcohol or gambling;
 - if the parties are no longer in love with each other

 - Support structures


Common documents needed?





- Certified ID copies of yourself and of your spouse
- Ante-nuptial contract (if applicable)
- Certified copies of children's birth certificates (if applicable)
- Marriage certificate
- Proof of address (not older than 3 months)
- Date of your marriage
- A list of assets in your joint and/or separate estates.


